

Councilmember Steve Goble

Councilmember Steve Goble was first elected to the El Cajon City Council in November, 2016 and re-elected in 2020 and 2024.

Councilmember Goble was raised in El Cajon and has lived in the City for over 40 years. He is a product of Fletchers Hill Elementary, Parkway Junior High, and Grossmont High School. Mr. Goble earned an Associate of Arts degree from Grossmont College, and a Bachelor of Science and Master's degrees in Business Administration from San Diego State University.

In January, 2021, Councilmember Goble retired from the private sector as executive vice president and Chief Brand Officer of a franchisor who provides shipping services in over 800 locations worldwide.

He also has served in leadership positions with the Salvation Army, the Make-A-Wish Foundation, SDSU's College of Business/Department of Marketing, and St. Paul's Senior Services. In December 2021, he joined the ranks of substitute teachers, serving the three high schools in El Cajon: Grossmont, Granite Hills, and El Cajon Valley. In 2022, he volunteered over 120 hours to help build emergency sleeping cabins for homeless women and their small children, currently in use at a local church.

He is the City's representative on the board of directors at the Metropolitan Transit System, SANDAG's Borders Committee, and is the past chair of the board of the East County Advanced Water Purification Program, a pioneering program turning wastewater into lake water.

Councilmember Goble's personal mission for serving on the City Council is "to increase the quality of life for residents and businesses of El Cajon and to attract those yet to be."
